### WATCH OUT FOR SCAMS .....

Cybercriminals entice you into providing personal data by phone, email, or clicking on seemingly innocent links that let criminals access your information on your computer! Scammers are very sophisticated ~ they pose as employees of familiar companies and drop personal details about you that make them seem legitimate. These details can be your birthday or your address ~ easy to find in an online search. Be skeptical!

Do not respond to a request for an account number or any personal information! Do not click on a link in an email! Don't trust anything that sounds too good to be true! Use different and complex passwords for every sensitive account (bank account, savings account, pension account, investment account, etc.). If somehow one of your passwords is revealed to a hacker, they can't use it for all your other accounts.

Be wary, my friends!

# Federal Extra COVID SNAP Ending

Due to federal action, the last COVID SNAP payment is on  
March 2, 2023

## How will this impact your SNAP benefits?

Starting in April, you will only get "1" monthly payment. That is your normal benefit. Find the amount on DTA Connect or by calling 877-382-2363.

## You may be able to increase your normal SNAP benefits by telling DTA about:

- Medical costs over \$35 a month for anyone in your SNAP household who is 60 or older or has a disability
- If your housing cost have gone up (rent/mortgage), and
  - Child or disabled adult care costs

The American Heart Association recommends eating:

- A wide variety of fruits and vegetables
- Whole grains or products that are a majority of whole grains
- Healthy sources of protein such as legumes, nuts, fish, seafood, low fat dairy, and lean, unprocessed poultry and meat
- Non-tropical vegetable oils, like olive oil or canola oil
- Minimally processed foods
- Minimize added sugars
- Minimize salt intake
- Limit alcohol intake

Eating this way does not prevent you from eating your favorite foods. With small modifications, your favorite meals can be made healthier.

If you are a registered voter, failure to respond to this annual census for two consecutive years shall result in the voter's name being removed from the voter's list.**
