

The WRTA van is utilized for your out-of-town doctor appointments. You need to register with them by calling 508-752-9283.


****** OXFORD FOOD SHELF ******

### OUTREACH MESSAGE: PREVENTING FALLS

More than 1 in 3 seniors falls each year. Your eyesight, hearing and reflexes might not be as sharp as they were when you were younger. Muscle weakness, problems with balance and gait, and blood pressure that drops when you get up are all risk factors. Take the following steps to decrease your risk: Stay physically active, have your eyes and hearing tested, find out all the side effects of any medicine you take, get enough sleep, limit the amount of alcohol you drink, use an assistive device if you need help feeling steady when you walk, take extra care when its wet or icy, and wear non-skid rubber-soled shoes.


Always tell your doctor if you fall!!

What should you do if you fall? Stay as calm as possible and take several deep breaths to try and relax. Stay on the floor or ground for a few moments. Decide if you are hurt before getting up. Roll onto your side and rest for a minute before you slowly get up on your hands and knees and crawl to a sturdy chair. Put your hands on the chair seat and slide one foot forward so that it is flat on the floor while keeping the other foot is still kneeling. Slowly rise and turn your body to sit in the chair.


Get On Track With The Essex Valley Steam Train!

BUS TRIP

1. When a bus trip is scheduled, it will be advertised at the Senior Center, in the monthly CHATTER, on Facebook, and posted on the town cable access channel.
2. We will only be using Fox Tours at this time as our tour vendor.
3. There is a 40 passenger minimum / 54 passenger maximum
4. Anyone wishing to sign up **MUST** place a **\$5.00 non-refundable** deposit, which will be taken off the cost of your trip ticket.
5. The cost of the bus trip will be payable in full by check, made payable to FOX TOURS.
6. If you are interested in purchasing a Fox Tours Motor Coach Tour Waiver, the fee is \$10.00, payable in a separate check, made payable to FOX TOURS. This payment is due 60 days prior to trip departure. (See Director for form).
7. The cost of the trip must be paid in full by July 1, 2022 to secure your seat, **NO EXCEPTIONS WILL BE MADE!**
8. All trip participants must complete a form that includes; name, address, phone #, emergency contact name and phone # prior to trip departure.
9. FOX TOURS IS REQUIRING GROUPS TO ENSURE ALL PASSENGERS HAVE HAD THE COVID-19 VACCINE AS A PREREQUISITE TO TRAVEL. This is to ensure passenger safety and well-being.
